CUT OUTS

1899	Western Australia granted voting rights to women.
1884	Henrietta Dugdale formed the first Australian women's suffrage society in Melbourne, Victoria in 1884.
1897	Catherine Helen Spence became the first female candidate to run for office.
1861	Propertied women in South Australia could vote in local municipal elections.
1903	Four women stood for federal election as independents - all were unsuccessful.
1901	Woman in South Australia and Western Australia voted on Federation.
1943	Enid Lyons became the Member for Darwin (in Tasmania) in the House of Representatives, and Dorothy Tangney was elected to represent Western Australia in the Senate.
1894	The Women's Suffrage Bill Women is passed in South Australia so they can vote for the Parliament of South Australia.
1902	The Commonwealth Franchise Act 1902 gave all non-indigenous women over 21 the right to vote and stand for election for federal Parliament.
1838	Female descendants of the Bounty mutineers who lived on Pitcairn Islands could vote.
1895	Queen Victoria ratifies women's vote.
