Australia fought alongside the Allies against the Axis powers, participating in battles in the Pacific, North Africa, and Europe.

Australia joined the conflict as part of the British Empire and played a significant role, notably at Gallipoli and on the Western Front.

Australia was part of the coalition forces that invaded Iraq in 2003, aimed at overthrowing the regime of Saddam Hussein.

Australia entered the war in support of South Vietnam against the communist North Vietnam, following the lead of the United States.

Following the September 11 attacks in 2001, Australia joined the US-led coalition to dismantle al-Qaeda and remove the Taliban from power in Afghanistan.

Australia contributed military support to the coalition forces in the liberation of Kuwait from Iraqi occupation.

Australian forces were involved in combating communist insurgents in Malaya as part of a Commonwealth effort.

Australia was part of the United Nations forces supporting South Korea against the North Korean invasion, which was backed by China and the Soviet Union.
