Crocodiles

Kakadu has both freshwater and saltwater crocodiles. Use the information listed below to create a Venn diagram of the differences and similarities between these crocodiles.

Fresh Water Crocodiles

- · Lives in tropical north Queensland
- · Are also known as Johnstone's Crocodiles
- · Are found in fresh water
- · Are only found in Australia
- Males grow up to 3m and females 2m
- Mature at 15 years of age
- \cdot Eat insects, fish, frogs, turtles, water birds and snakes
- May bite but won't eat people
- · Females lay up to 12 eggs at a time
- \cdot Breed during the dry season of July and August
- · Have long thin snouts, with a straight jawline
- · All their teeth are nearly equal in size

Salt Water Crocodiles

- · Lives in tropical north Queensland
- · Are found outside Australia
- · Live in salt water
- Mature at 15 years of age
- · Females grow to 4m and males to 7m
- · Males can weigh over 1000Kg
- · Eat cattle, wallabies, pigs and people.
- · Breed during the wet season of November to March
- · Females lay up to 50 eggs at a time
- · Have powerful broad snouts with an uneven jawline
- · Their teeth vary in size with some almost twice the size of others
