

Make a short-tailed shearwater migration picture using stamping.

You Will Need:

Art paper
Strong cardboard
Blue paint
Black paint
White paint
Paint brush

- 1. Using the blue paint if it is light blue or the white paint with some blue added paint the top 2/3rd of the page.
- 2. Using, either the blue paint as it is if it is dark blue or the blue paint mixed with some black, paint the bottom third of the picture. The line between the section need not be straight and small up strokes will give the impression of waves.
- 3. When dry add some small flecks of white to the bottom 2/3rd section to look like waves.
- 4. Cut a strip of carboard about 6cm long. Fold the carboard in the half and then fold each end back to the middle so it is in quarters. Open the 2 sides back and curve them slightly out so you have a bird stamp.
- 5. Mix some grey paint and stamp the bird print on the light blue background. Some birds can be darting into the water to get fish too but mainly a mass of birds in the sky.
- 6. When dry use the paint brush to paint 1 darker grey, slightly larger bird towards the right hand side of the page.
- 7. When dry use a lead pencil to write number 625 on this darker bird.
